

# Galveston Central Raps Gators, 28-0

Dickinson—Awesome Galveston Central, ranked No. 9 in the state and No. 3 in the area, turned all-state candidate Charles Crawford loose for 235 yards in 13 carries, then survived 145 yards in penalties to bury Dickinson 28-0 in a key District 12-AAA South Zone battle here Friday night.

Thus, Coach Ed Mitchell's Bearcats in recording their seventh victory of the season without a loss, moved into sole possession of first place in the zone race with only Hitchcock and La Marque Lincoln left to play.

Crawford, who gained over 200 yards for the second straight week, furnished the overflow

throng of 7000 an idea of what was in store early in the first quarter when he stepped 80 yards untouched for a touchdown. The tally came on Central's second offensive play of the game. Larry Beyeince booted the PAT and the Bearcats were off and running.

Kenneth Pope set the second

touchdown drive in motion late in the second stanza when he recovered a fumble on the Dickinson 33. Three plays later, full-back Roy Bonner burst up the middle and stormed 28 yards for the counter. Beyeince again toed the extra point.

In the fourth quarter, reserve Bearcat quarterback Alphonse Freeman tossed an eight yard scoring pass to end Larry Smiley, climaxing a 65-yard, six-play thrust. Big play in the drive was Crawford's 54-yard scamper. Bonner rammed over the two-point conversion to boost the count to 22-0.

Central traveled 41 yards in four plays for its final marker. Quarterback Kenneth Humphrey got the TD on a 23-yard run on a bootleg after a magnificent fake to Crawford. Not a Gator laid a hand on Humphrey and few even knew he had the ball until it was too late.

Dickinson penetrated Central's 20 on three occasions only to be stopped by the tough Central defense spearheaded by line-backer Roy Justice and end Robert Dorsey. Justice recorded 11 tackles and Dorsey nine.

Ronnie Caltagirone led Dickinson ball carriers, pounding out 111 yards in 21 tries while safety Leroy Mason geared the Gator defense with eight tackles, an intercepted pass and a blocked punt.
